Through our testing services, education program, onsite clinic and pharmacy, and support service and care coordination team, SAAF is committed to helping end HIV as an epidemic by ensuring access to holistic, culturally-affirming and inclusive systems of care.

SAAF is looking for a bright, outgoing, and compassionate **Testing and Outreach Specialist** to provide high-quality sexual health testing, education and support services to individuals and communities disproportionately affected by HIV. The **Testing and Outreach Specialist** works as part of a team to conduct outreach across a variety of online and offline platforms, provide HIV/STI testing, education, and support/referral services in-office and offsite, as well as initiate linkage and engagement to HIV-medical care and biomedical HIV-prevention tools.

In collaboration with program and agency staff, service providers, and community members, the **Testing and Outreach Specialist** is responsible for the implementation and facilitation of the Focused HIV Testing, Linkage to Care, and Condom Distribution program, which provides culturally-affirming, scientifically-accurate, and holistic HIV prevention and care services to gay and bisexual men, transgender women, and other members of the gender and sexual diverse community.

While job training is provided through multiple channels, possessing various **fundamental skills and abilities** are central for position competency and proficiency:

- Excellent verbal, written and interpersonal communication skills
- Strong sense of urgency, professionalism, boundaries, and integrity

Requirements

- High school diploma or GED
- Valid driver's license and a safe driving record
- Minimum of 1 year experience working in HIV/AIDS prevention, community or public health, social service, or health promotion
- Minimum of 1 year experience working with communities of gender and sexual diversity (GSD)

Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in Health or related field (preferred)
- Bilingual English and Spanish (strongly preferred)

Schedule

Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Saturday 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM, Tuesday 11:00 AM to 8:00 PM, with flexible scheduling to accommodate onsite and offsite evening and weekend shifts per 40-hour schedule.
